TREASURE Is Launched

A large-scale, multidisciplinary Research & Innovation Action started on 1st April 2015 under the framework of Horizon 2020 - Sustainable Food and Security. TREASURE will run for 4 years and will focus on the valorisation of European local pig breeds.

TREASURE is coordinated by Agricultural Institute of Slovenia (KIS) with Marjeta Čandek-Potokar as project coordinator and scientific responsible. The project involves 25 partner institutions and 12 linked third parties in 9 European countries with strong experience in the European traditional food sector.

This newsletter will provide readers with a short overview of project objectives, updates from each work package and attended events.



TREASURE's Research

Research and development activities are proposed for the benefit of sustainable pork chains based on European local pig breeds and their production systems. TREASURE is planned to respond to consumer demands for quality and healthiness of pork products with regional identity and societal demands for environment preservation and development of local agro-economy.

WORK PACKAGE UPDATES

WP1 Phenotypic and genetic characterization of regional autochthonous pig populations in Europe

In the first six month of the project WP1 has concentrated on preliminary developments to demonstrate singularity of local pig populations, particularly the untapped ones at different levels: phenotypic, genomic and transcriptomic.

In this regard as a first step UNIFI started the coordination

of these activities, especially to ensure the data collection of phenotypes including protocols for phenotypic characterization and demographic information collection. INIA and UNIBO started the constitution of internal databases for genotyping data already available in several breeds. INIA started to design

genotyping protocols for DNA sampling and major gene genotyping and performed faecal sampling for metagenomics analysis. Finally UNIBO started the activities for the task related to the identification of genomic regions under selection pressure in local pig breeds.

WP2 Performance and management of local pig breeds in their production systems

TREASURE objectives are related to improved *quality and healthiness aspects* of regional pork product by means of innovation in management and feeding strategies. In this first phase KIS is coordinating the initial step for data and sample collection of

productive traits in local pig breeds. INRA produced and distributed a survey protocol to assess the impact of production system on productivity, welfare and environment. On-farm surveys already started. Many partners started their experiments according to the work plan aiming at the evaluation of **nutritional requirements**, innovative feeding strategies and feeding resources in relation to product quality. Most of the experiments are actually running and will continue during 2016.

WP3 Traditional and new high quality products with regional identity

The main ambition of WP3 is to enhance quality and health benefits of traditional pork products (TPP) from local pig breeds, as their sustainability depends upon the successful marketing of their products. Although most of the tasks will be initiated in the following months the activities are progressing well.

INRA as WP leader, with the support of UNIFI and KIS, IFIP, BESH, UNIZG, PFOS, UNIBO, LUHS, IPVC, UEVORA, UNIBG, INIA, IRTA, coordinated the activities regarding the development of a toolbox for the evaluation of sensory, healthy, technological and typical qualities of pork and pork products.

Additionally IFIP with the support of KIS, KGZS-NM, BESH, IPVC and PFOS organized the initial consultation for a task aiming at the **development of a database** on carcass and meat quality traits which will be available for the different breed populations involved in the project.

WP4 Consumer preferences and market research for sustainable pork chains

This WP aims at analysing the socioeconomic impact of the suggested changes in WP1, 2 and 3 on specific production systems and traditional products from local breeds along the food chain.

As direct result of the abovementioned work-packages the work has not fully started yet but some preparatory tasks have been settled by CREDA. In the frame of the **cost and benefit** analysis at farm and product level a survey was sent to partners about the production system in order to know the main characteristics of the production of local pig breeds in each case studies. IRTA organized a meeting between CREDA and the Majorcan Black Pig industry actors in Mallorca. Furthermore, in regard to the cost-benefit analysis for the society, CREDA is carrying on a literature review on studies

addressing the public goods provided by agricultural system and more specifically by livestock breeding systems and traditional breeds. Finally a questionnaire is about to be submitted to the partners, consisting in openended questions to map the relevant public goods provided by traditional pig breed breeds in each case study.

WP5 Measures to maximize impact

This WP includes measures to maximise the impact of research results at several levels, from dissemination, exploitation of results, to demonstration and communication, and actively involves all the partners. Activities are addressing all the relevant stakeholders and the general public. In the first semester CeRTA as WP leader has been responsible of the:

- creation and maintenance of showcase website www.treasure.kis.si
- creation and maintenance of

social media accounts (Facebook and Twitter)

- regular communication of updates and events through webpage and social media
- dissemination of project overview, objectives and preliminary material through the web
- collection of dissemination reports of attended events

Several partners have been actively involved in dissemination activities: KIS, KGZS, UL, UNIFI, UNIBO, BESH, INRA, IFIP, SSICA, IRTA, INIA, UNIZG, UEVORA, PFOS participated in international events and congresses at European level whereas KIS, KGSZ, CICYTEX, UNIFI and INIA organized also targeted workshops.

CeRTA started the design of the collective trademark, which will be one of the most important output of the project as start-up point for the development of a sustainable pork chain quality standard. UNIBO and KIS have been involved in this first step; discussion with WP leaders is currently open.
